# **OUR STORY: PLANTING THE** SEED FOR SMILE FARMS

Several years ago, Jim McCann received a call that led him to the initial idea for Smile Farms: one that would change the lives of the McCann family, while greatly improving the prospects for adults with developmental disabilities, their families, and communities.

At the time, Jim's brother Kevin lived at the Independent Group Home Living (IGHL) in Moriches, NY, a residence for people with developmental disabilities. IGHL founder and CEO Walter Stockton knew Kevin and other adult residents would flourish if they had the chance to work at meaningful jobs. But employment opportunities for developmentally delayed adults were scarce. On the call, Walter wondered if Jim could help. He could.

# SMILE FARMS IN ACTION

From valuable employment opportunities to New York State-accredited vocational training for those seeking gardening, horticulture and agriculturalrelated occupations, Smile Farms offers unique opportunities at each of its partner campuses across New York. See how each one is making a difference.

#### **Smile Farms at Independent Group Home Living (IGHL)**

MORICHES, NY

• Employees grow annuals, perennials and herbs in 19 greenhouses, with produce sold in an onsite retail store and to local florists and communities.

#### **Smile Farms at Cornell Cooperative Extension in partnership with IGHL**

YAPHANK, NY

• Employees grow produce that helps offset the food costs for IGHL's many facilities.

#### Smile Farms at Holly's Guest House/IGHL

CENTER MORICHES, NY

 Employees grow organic produce that supplies IGHL residential kitchens.

### **Smile Farms at IGHL Administration Building**

MANORVILLE, NY

• Employees grow organic herbs and produce in a greenhouse and four raised beds that are utilized in meals for IGHL residents.

#### Smile Farms at the Viscardi Center ALBERTSON, NY

- Employees grow vegetables hydroponically and in garden beds.
- To prepare future gardeners, horticulture has been incorporated into the Center's science curriculum.

# **Smile Farms at Family Residences** and Essential Enterprises (FREE)

OAKDALE, NY

• Employees tend raised beds as well as a year-round hoop house and greenhouse, growing vegetables and herbs, with the harvest used in the onsite kitchen.

## Smile Farms at League Education & Treatment Center (LETC)

BROOKLYN, NY

• Employees tend raised beds, a hoop house that allows for yearround operations and a sensory garden where a variety of peppers are grown for use in Smile Farms Hot Sauce.



- Select students participate in a New York State Department of Educationaccredited agricultural education curriculum, learning about horticulture, while getting hands-on experience and earning credits toward their diploma.
- Smile Farms at LETC broke the mold by turning their fall harvest into a marketable product—hot sauce. Through their Smile Farms-funded partnership with Brooklyn Grange, the team at LETC harvested 337 pounds of sweet and hot peppers that were bottled into nearly 1,000 bottles of red and green hot sauce.

Brooklyn Grange is the leading rooftop farming and intensive green roofing business in the US. They operate the world's largest rooftop soil farms, located on three roofs in New York City, and grow over 80,000 lbs. of organically-cultivated produce per year.

- The two varieties each feature different artwork created by consumers in LETC's League Artist Natural Design (LAND) program.
- Smile Farms hosted a corporate Pop-Up sale for the hot sauce at Salesforce's Headquarters in Bryant Park and a second one at the 1-800-FLOWERS.COM, Inc. corporate offices on Long Island.

- · Government agencies, advocacy groups, and businesses gain a model for how to successfully build partnerships leading to inclusive employment opportunities.


